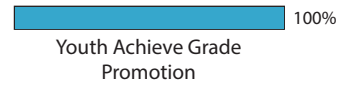
OUR MISSION:

To create opportunities for individuals and families to reach self-sufficiency through support services, education, employment, and leadership.



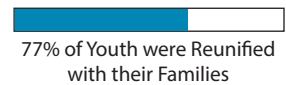
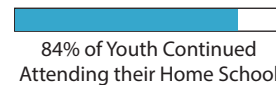
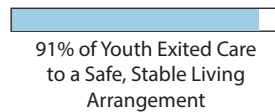
YOUTH LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT (YLD)

An after school program for at-risk middle school youth ages 11-15 to build leadership skills and conduct community service projects. Youth who are not already involved in positive after school activities and therefore most at-risk are recruited to join YLD through their school in Newport, Covington, Erlanger, Dayton, and Campbell County Middle Schools. Referral only programming offered in-school using the Wyman Top curriculum at Summit View Academy. Youth who enter high school may join Teen Coalition which is active in Newport and Campbell County High School.



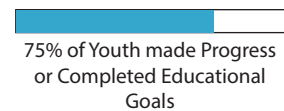
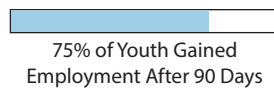
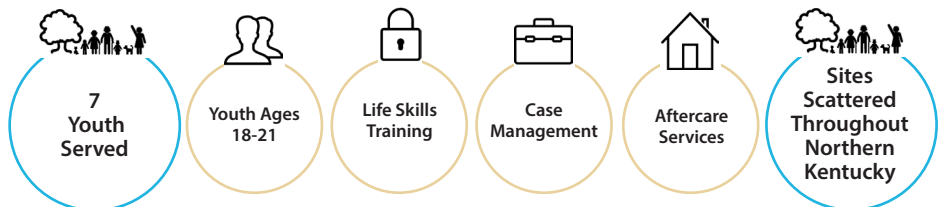
HOMeward BOUND SHELTER

A 24-hour emergency shelter location in Covington, KY, that provides a safe environment and residential treatment services for runaway, homeless, abused, neglected, and dependant youth ages 11-17.



INDEPENDENT LIVING PROGRAM (ILP)

Provides scattered site independent living services along with life skills training and case management for youth ages 18-21 who are committed to the state.



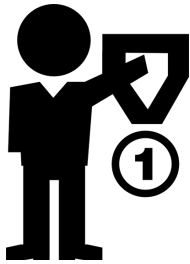
