



HOME INSTRUCTION FOR PRESCHOOL YOUNGSTERS (HIPPA)

Home visiting services for Boone, Campbell, Grant, and Kenton County families with children ages 3-5 that focus on helping parents prepare their preschool children for success in school. Home Visitors help parents mingle learning and play throughout the structured 30-week HIPPA curriculum for 3 and 4 years olds. There is also a 15 week curriculum for 5 year olds.




Children Enrolled for a Program Year



EVERY CHILD SUCCEEDS (ECS)

Home visitation for first time parents in Campbell, Boone, and Grant Counties, in which families receive weekly home visits, eventually transitioning to bi-weekly and then monthly. During the home visit, the Family Support Worker takes curriculum material that correlates to the age of the child and is designed to ensure an optimal start for children both physically and emotionally. The age-appropriate activities serve as a way to model positive play with parents. Parents can enter the program prenatally or before the baby turns 3 months old and remain until the child's third birthday. This is an eight county best practice initiative in Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky.
