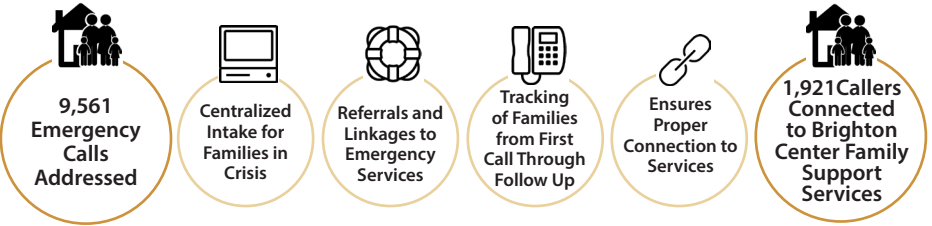
OUR MISSION:

## SERVICE LINK

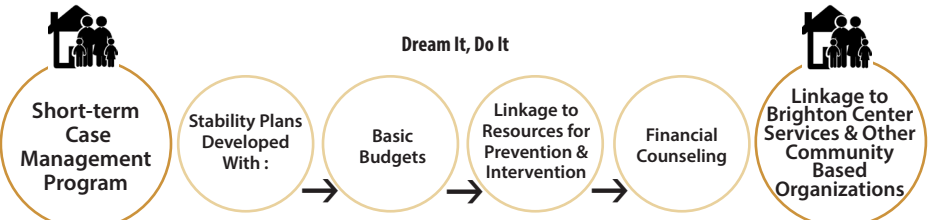

## FAMILY SUPPORT



We are the only agency to provide financial emergency assistance & food pantry services to families in all 8 counties of Northern Kentucky.



**Supportive Housing Rural Case Management:** Works with families who are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness in rural Boone, Kenton, & Campbell Counties and all of Grant, Carroll, Gallatin, & Pendleton Counties.

The Family Center is a pick-up location for the Federal USDA Commodities Supplemental Food Program. Campbell, Grant, & Carroll County households that meet the federal income guidelines are eligible for food once per month.

families reported USDA Commodities helped reduce their reliance on food pantries, emergency assistance, or public assistance.

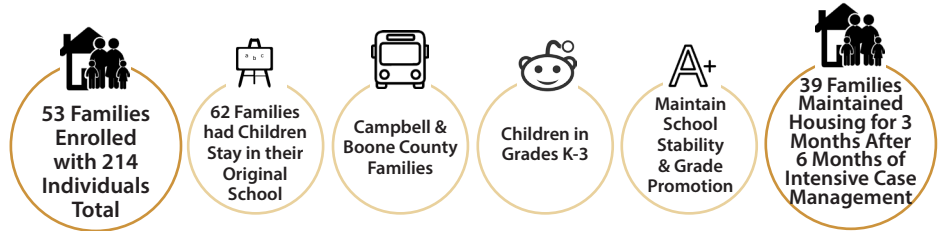


3,541

## STABLE FAMILIES

Serving families with children in grades K-3 in Campbell or Boone Counties that are at imminent risk of homelessness to stabilize their housing situation. The ideal outcome is that children maintain school stability and grade promotion.



## SENIOR SUPPORT

Serving seniors living at Brighton Properties' Saratoga Place I and II Apartments along with Two Rivers Apartments to connect them with services that will allow seniors to "age in place."



## COMMUNITY GARDENS & MOBILE MARKETS

Newport residents have access to grow their own fresh foods through the Newport Community Gardens project. A group of passionate community members, supporters, and organizations came together in the fall of 2014 to build nearly 200 4' by 8' low-maintenance, raised-bed gardens. This collaborative project began with community partners working together to accomplish two goals:

- (1) increase access to fresh vegetables for the residents.
- (2) increase knowledge of ways to grow, harvest, and cook the vegetables so everyone can enjoy a healthier diet.
