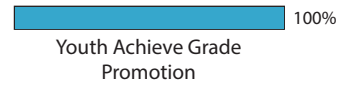
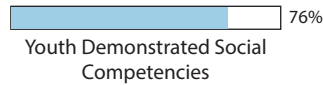
OUR MISSION:

To create opportunities for individuals and families to reach self-sufficiency through support services, education, employment, and leadership.



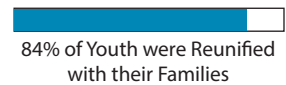
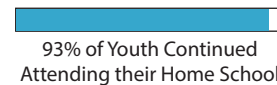
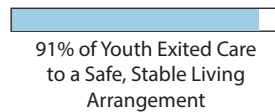
## YOUTH LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT (YLD)

An after school program for at-risk middle school youth ages 11-15 to build leadership skills and conduct community service projects. Youth who are not already involved in positive after school activities and therefore most at-risk are recruited to join YLD through their school in Newport, Covington, Erlanger, Dayton, and Campbell County Middle Schools. Referral only programming offered in-school using the Wyman Top curriculum at Summit View Academy. Youth who enter high school may join Teen Coalition which is active in Newport and Campbell County High School.



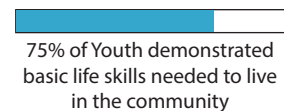
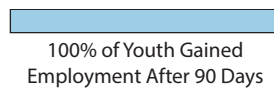
## HOMeward BOUND SHELTER

A 24-hour emergency shelter located in Covington, KY, that provides a safe environment and residential treatment services for runaway, homeless, abused, neglected, and dependent youth ages 11-17.



## INDEPENDENT LIVING PROGRAM (ILP)

Provides scattered site independent living services along with life skills training and case management for youth ages 18-21 who are committed to the state.



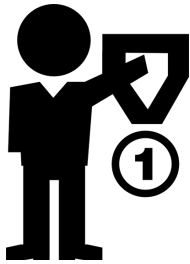

An outreach program run by Homeward Bound Shelter that helps youth in crisis through the management of over 150 sites within the community of trained volunteers and businesses. Youth are connected immediately to safe and supportive services. Locations include fast food restaurants, convenience stores, fire stations, libraries, and city buses which all display the Safe Place sign.

## TEENS LINKED TO CARE (TLC)

Teens Linked to Care (TLC) is focused on prevention services for teens related to substance abuse and HIV/STD's in southern Campbell County. Teens Linked to Care involves three parts, the curriculum taught within the high school, a Youth Advisory Board comprised of Campbell County High School student leaders, and a Community Advisory Board. This is a collaborative effort with our partners Campbell County High School and Campbell County Drug Free Alliance.
