NORTHERN KENTUCKY SCHOLAR HOUSE

Northern Kentucky Scholar House is a part of a comprehensive statewide, two-generational self-sufficiency program for single parent families that provides affordable housing, child development services, and case management support as they pursue a degree in higher education. Northern Kentucky Scholar House is a partnership between Brighton Center and Neighborhood Foundations. The newly constructed 48 apartments and the Early Scholars Child Development Center are located at the corner of West Sixth Street and Patterson in Newport, KY.

Eligibility Criteria:

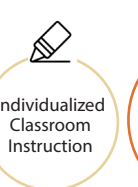
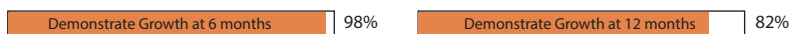
- Individuals at least 18 years of age
- A single parent with primary custody of their child/children
- A full-time student or have been admitted for full-time enrollment in an approved post-secondary institution (MOUs with Northern Kentucky University, Gateway Community & Technical College, and Cincinnati State)
- Monthly life skills workshops and meetings to partner with parents to achieve their educational goals resulting in self-sufficiency
- Children under the age of 5 must be enrolled in Early Scholars Child Development Center
- Must be eligible for Section 8 subsidized housing
- Interested in achieving long-term self-sufficiency



EARLY SCHOLARS CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Located in the West End neighborhood of Newport, Early Scholars is a Kentucky All Stars 5 Star Rated quality child development center in which children receive individualized classroom instruction to prepare them for success in school. Emphasis is on quality of interactions among staff and children. The Center utilizes developmentally appropriate, research based curriculum, high standards of health and safety practices, highly qualified staff, and provides an enriching learning and physical environment, individualized classroom instruction, and parent involvement activities.
