Where Kids Get Help... **FAST!**



Homeward Bound is an emergency shelter that provides a safe environment and services for youth ages 11-17 in crisis and runaway or homeless.

Since 1983, more than 270,000 youth have accessed a Safe Place location and have received the help that they needed through their local shelter agency.

Safe Place has a network of more than 19,000 sites in 39 states, including businesses, fire stations, police stations, and community buildings.

In 2011, 6,273 youth were helped immediately through a Safe Place site and brought to the local agency.

Another 6,414 youth were helped through Safe Place services in other ways.

Youth can hear about Safe Place sites through school, media, community, and word of mouth.
